



The Stuttgart State Museum of Natural History is one of Baden-Württemberg's most popular museums. The exhibitions are housed in two separate buildings. In the Museum am Löwentor, you can find the paleontological exhibition, documenting the history of life on Earth. In contrast, Schloss Rosenstein provides an overview of present-day animal diversity and Earth's major ecosystems.

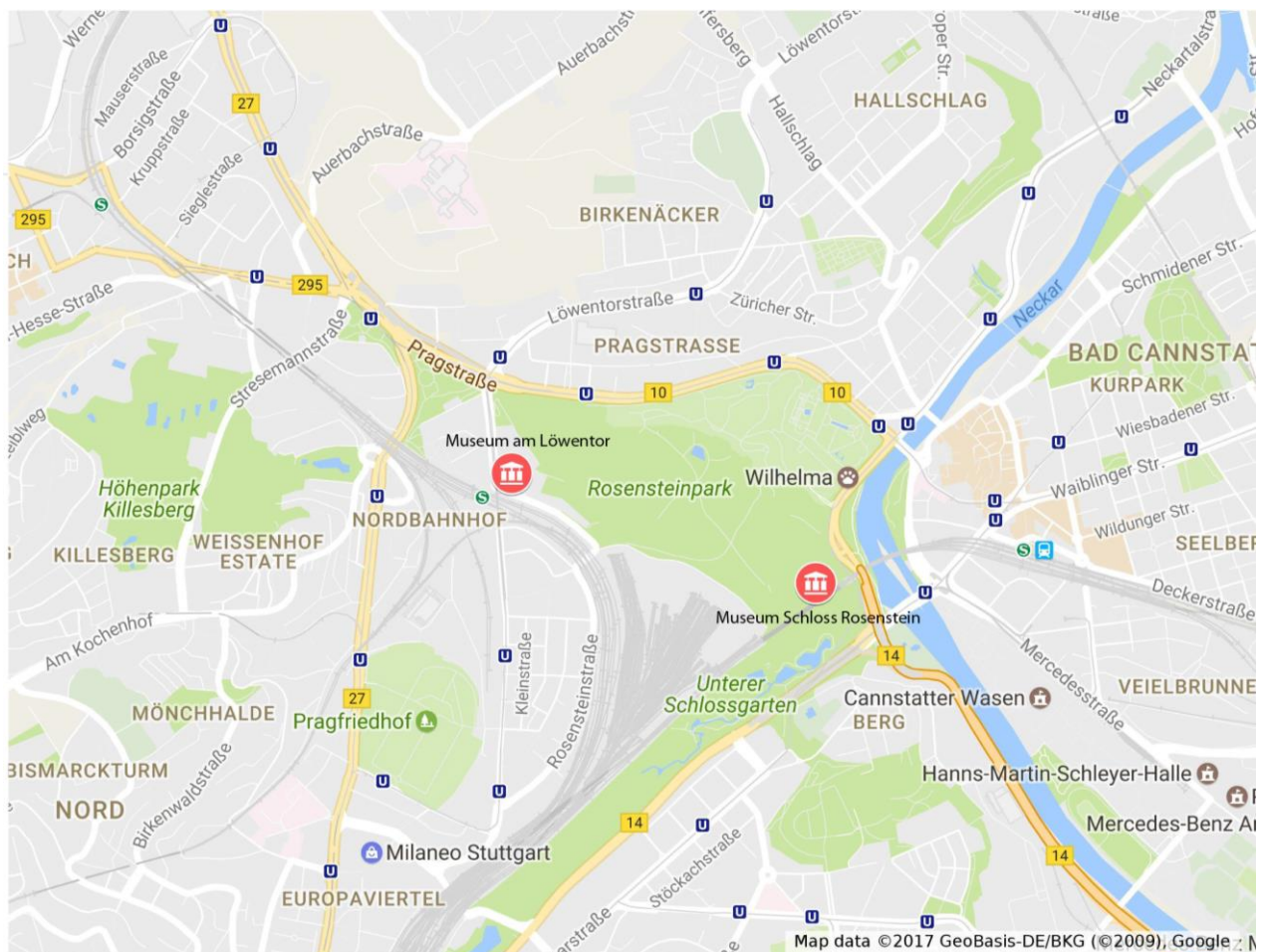
The Naturkundemuseum Stuttgart is open from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Tuesday to Friday. From 10 a.m. until 6 p.m. on Saturday, Sunday and Bank Holidays. The museum is closed on Mondays.

Admission for adults to the Permanent Exhibition is 5 Euros (discount tickets: 3 Euros, Combined ticket for both buildings: 6 Euros). Familyticket: 11 Euros. **Admission is free for Refugees.** Admission is free for everybody Wednesday 1-5 p.m.
